

The Canadian Engineering Memorial Foundation has awarded the University of Manitoba's **Access Program for Women in Science and Engineering (WISE)** with the 1998 Engineering Students Project Award. To promote and celebrate careers in engineering and science, WISE provides presentations by female science and engineering students to an audience of approximately 20,000 high school students each year. The award was created to encourage women to consider engineering careers.

The Canadian Council of Professional Engineers (CCPE) has awarded its 1998 national scholarships to six professional engineers, including five PEO members. The CCPE-Meloche Monnex Scholarship, a \$7,500 cash award for further study and research in a non-engineering field, was given to **Teena Fazio, P.Eng.**,

who is currently pursuing an MBA at INSEAD in Fontainebleau, France, and to **Paul Ward, P.Eng.**, a PhD student in computer science at the University of Waterloo. The CCPE-Manulife Financial Scholarship, a \$10,000 cash award to pursue further engineering study or research, was awarded to **Kevin McKague, P.Eng.**, a master of science student in environmental engineering at the University of Guelph, and **Kesava Rajagopalan, P.Eng.**, a PhD student in electrical engineering at Dalhousie University. **Medhat Shehata, P.Eng.**, a PhD student in civil engineering at the University of

Toronto, received the CCPE-Encon Endowment of \$5,000 for further university studies in engineering failure investigation, risk management and/or materials testing.

**Enghouse Systems Ltd.** has won the Branham/Canaccord Softworld Award for Turnaround Company of the Year. The award is granted to CSCE members who have made significant contributions to the practice of civil engineering in Canada and whose volunteer service has furthered the aims of CSCE.

**Robert Gillespie, P.Eng.**, chair and CEO, General Electric Canada, has been chosen as the 1999 recipient of the Canadian Council of Professional Engineers Gold Medal Award, which bestows distinction on outstanding engineers and recognizes exceptional achievements in their chosen fields. Throughout his 40-year career, Gillespie has played a key role in building and strengthening GE Canada and the profession in general. He has served on numerous PEO committees, and was president of the association from 1994-95.

The American Nuclear Society has awarded **Robert Jervis, PhD, P.Eng.** with the 1998 William Ehmann Award for outstanding contributions in applied nuclear science and nuclear education. Professor emeritus in nuclear science and engineering at the University of Toronto, Jervis is the first person living outside the United States to receive this award.

**Robert J. Mitchell, P.Eng.**, and **Archibald N. Sherbourne, P.Eng.**, have received accolades from the Engineering Institute of Canada (EIC). Mitchell was awarded the Julian C. Smith medal for achievement in the development of Canada. Sherbourne won the John B. Stirling medal in recognition of leadership and service to EIC and its member societies at the national level.

**Watts, Griffis and McQuat Ltd., Consulting Geologists and Engineers**, was presented with a Special Achievement Award by the Prospectors and Developers Association of Canada. The award recognizes the company as one that has excelled in consulting skills, planning and exploration programs, and the finding and planning of mines.

**Dr. Owen White, P.Eng.**, has been awarded the Hans Cloos medal from the Canadian National Group of the International Association for Engineering Geology and the Environment (IAEG). The first Canadian to receive the award, Dr. White was the founding chair of the Canadian Geotechnical Society's engineering geology division.
