

Call for Volunteers – Sterling Award Subcommittee

Professional Engineers Ontario (PEO) continues to promote leadership development among engineering interns through its G. Gordon M. Sterling Engineering Intern Award. Currently, PEO is seeking applications to fill two vacancies on the Sterling Award Subcommittee of the Awards Committee and invites Professional Engineer license holders, who preferably have known G. Gordon M. Sterling, to apply.

Background

The G. Gordon M. Sterling Engineering Intern Award was introduced in 2010 to promote and encourage professional leadership development of engineering graduates.

About the Award

The G. Gordon M. Sterling Engineering Intern Award is available to engineering interns who are registered in good standing with PEO's Engineering Intern (EIT) Program and is conferred annually at the Order of Honour Award Ceremony, during PEO's Annual General Meeting weekend. The award provides funding of up to \$3500 to defray the costs associated with enrolment in a leadership development programs offered by a recognized institution.

About the Sterling Award Subcommittee

The Sterling Award Subcommittee is composed of volunteer representatives from the PEO Awards Committee, representatives from the Sterling Family, volunteer representatives who have been inducted into the Order of Honour, and a past recipient of the G. Gordon M. Sterling Engineering Intern Award.

The Sterling Award Subcommittee recommends the annual recipient of the Sterling Award to the Awards Committee as well as defines and periodically reviews the award's terms of reference, application form, selection criteria and process, criteria for suitable leadership development programs, and communication plan.

Time commitment

The Sterling Award Subcommittee meets twice per year – once in person, to select the award recipient and second time via teleconference, to review the application process and the award communication plan.

Who can apply

Professional Engineer license holder (P.Eng.) in good standing with PEO, may apply. It is preferred for the applicants:

- To have known G. Gordon M. Sterling,
- To have been inducted into the Order of Honour,
- To have experience and knowledge of leadership development training programs,
- To have leadership experience in diverse areas, related to the Sterling Award and the Sterling Award Subcommittee (including local PEO Chapter), and
- To have knowledge of PEO's EIT Program.
