OTTAWA VAINER MPP TAKES ON LIBERAL ATTORNEY GENERAL CRITIC ROLE

Ontario Liberal Party Leader **Steven Del Duca** has announced the party's critic roles.

Lucille Collard, MPP (Ottawa-Vanier) (photo right) is the new Attorney General Critic. The Attorney General's office is the Ministry responsible for the *Professional Engineers Act*.

MPP Collard's other Critic portfolios are Women's Issues, Solicitor General and Environment, Conservation and Parks.

She was elected in a by-election in February 2020.

MPP Collard previously worked as a lawyer and as a trustee and board chair of the Conseil des écoles publiques de l'Est de l'Ontario (Eastern Ontario Public School Board).

PEO VICE PRESIDENT (ELECTED) SHARES HER THOUGHTS ON THE GLP

Below is a June 10th interview with PEO Vice President (elected) **Darla Campbell**, P.Eng. She was sworn in at the PEO AGM on May 30. She was previously Chair of the Government Liaison Committee (GLC) from 2011-2017.

1. What is your experience dealing with the political process?

My first experience with the political process was helping my mom get elected as a school trustee in Dauphin, Manitoba when I was old enough to drop off flyers on my own.

Through my volunteer leadership roles with the Canadian Federation of Business and Professional Women (BPW Canada), I helped to write resolutions that became briefs to the federal and the provincial governments on topics related to the environment, childcare and equality in the workplace. We developed a campaign for "Dignity and Decorum" in parliament and legislatures.

I was invited to speak to the Committee on the Status of Women on Parliament Hill on the challenges of women working in nontraditional fields like engineering.



PEO Vice President (elected) **Darla Campbell,** P.Eng. was the Chair of the Government Liaison Committee from 2015-2017.

In 2003, I ran for Halton regional council, and in 2004 and 2007 ran for Federal nominations in Oakville. In my professional role at Dillon Consulting, understanding how governments make decisions is a key factor in successfully delivering projects for our clients.

2. Why did you get interested in government liaison activities at PEO?

I was invited to join the Government Liaison Committee (GLC) when it was formed back in 2011, as the oversight body for the Government Liaison Program (GLP). My position on the GLC was the designated 'member active in a riding association' and I was elected as the Chair after Barry Steinberg stepped down.

I very much enjoyed being asked to Chair the first PEO-OSPE Government Relations Conference in 2011. We had some amazing speakers, including former Education Minister Sean Conway, Terry Fallis, the Stephen Leacock Award Winning Author, and Doris Grinspun, CEO, Registered Nurses Association of Ontario. As GLC Chair, I helped organize the 2016 PEO-OSPE Government Relations Conference. We had panels with other regulatory bodies and MPPs, including the now Leader of the Opposition, Andrea Horwath.

I was also pleased to participate in seven 'Take Your MPP to Work Days' across the province, and eight annual Queen's Park receptions, several of which I was asked to be the Master of Ceremonies for. At these sessions I got to see first-hand, the value of informing MPPs of the role of engineers in their communities, and showing them PEO's contribution of protecting the public interest.

I believe strongly in the need for the voice of engineers to be heard at the decision-making table of governments at all levels, and I felt as though the GLC and GLP would be a good way to apply my experience with the political process.

3. What do you think the biggest challenges are for the GLP?

The internal challenge is to provide the right support and training for volunteers who want to participate in the GLP. The external challenge is to focus on regulatory issues.

However, I know MPPs take an interest in engineers who are aware of issues being debated at Queen's Park, particularly in regards to protecting the public interest. I would be remiss if I didn't acknowledge that during COVID-19, it is harder to maintain relationships with the Government.

I have been impressed with the number of Chapter GLP Chairs and representatives that have been participating in online events with Ministers and MPPs.

4. What do you think the biggest opportunities are for the GLP?

I see the biggest opportunity for the GLP is to focus on regulatory issues, i.e. take on tasks and initiatives that meet the activity filter test, and to do that really well. This provides a leadership opportunity for our volunteers, as well as building engineers' capacity in knowing how the political process works.

PEO's GLP creates awareness of our regulatory role with MPPs across the province. Another area of opportunity for the GLP is to not forget PEO's role in encouraging both locally and internationally educated engineering graduates to get licensed.

I know both MPPs and the Fairness Commissioner want to see PEO helping get new engineers licensed. It is often newly licensed members that have the most interest in the GLP year after year in the Chapters.

A final thought, could the GLP help to strengthen the brand of "the P.Eng." through its focus on regulatory issues? If so, that's a big opportunity.
