PREMIER ANNOUNCES YORK UNIVERSITY EXPANSION

Premier **Doug Ford**, MPP (Etobicoke North) with York University President, **Rhonda Lenton** at the announcement on July 24th on the province's plan to fund York University's expansion to Markham.

Premier **Doug Ford**, MPP (Etobicoke North), has announced that the province will fund the Markham Centre Campus of York University. The announcement was made on July 24th.

The new campus will attract thousands of students living in York region who will now have increased access to a high quality research intensive local learning experience. Also participating in the event were a number of municipal and provincial representatives.

This week, the Premier announced that both Toronto and Peel will move to stage 3 of the province's reopening plan. He also kicked off the next leg of his tour with a series of stops in Durham region.

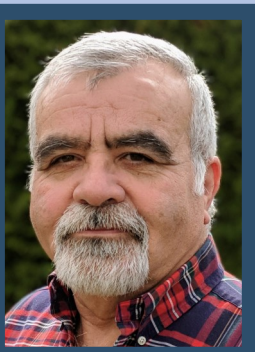

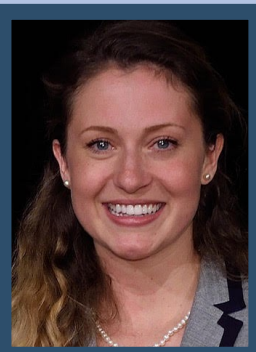

PEO EIT REP BRINGS NATIONAL EXPERIENCE TO GOVERNMENT LIAISON COMMITTEE

This week's interview is with **Alexandra Weryha**, EIT, who is the new EIT Representative for the PEO Government Liaison Program. The interview was done on July 26.

1. What is your experience dealing with the political process?

The majority of my experience dealing with the political process has been within student government. I obtained my first elected position in student council and continued to serve on a variety of governing bodies throughout my education.

A desire to serve others and the communities I am involved in has been a common thread throughout my career. I was elected representative for the mechanical engineering graduate students' association. I was also involved in several initiatives pertaining to the development of curriculum to teach engineers frameworks for understanding the environmental and societal implications of their work.

Through this initiative I attended the Engineering Change Lab, where I observed the importance of developing relationships across organizational and disciplinary silos.

2. Why did you get interested in government liaison activities at PEO?

The engagement process around policy development and regulation has always intrigued me. Through my own involvement in this process, I have come to cherish hearing perspectives that contradict my own. I believe that the best solutions reflect and balance the broadest set of needs to society's grand challenges.

As an EIT working towards my license, I am always looking for opportunities to get involved and learn.

I also look forward to supporting meaningful engagement between GLP members and their MPPs, particularly during the upcoming PEO virtual Government Relations Conference on November 6th.

3. What do you think the biggest challenges are of the GLP?

Given that the GLP exists as a geographically distributed organization, engaging its stakeholders during the physical distancing restrictions of COVID will continue to present challenges. The GLP will likely have to adapt some of its previous engagement methods, such as its annual conference, to ensure that its stakeholders can be effectively engaged in the new normal.

4. What do you think the biggest opportunities are for the GLP?

Society and its needs continually evolve; as technologies are engineered and implemented to meet these needs, the governing body of engineers must also be engaged in this continued dialogue between industry, academia, regulators, and society. I am excited to see the GLP hone its curriculum and develop support systems and tools that will ensure its stakeholders are communicating clearly with MPPs around regulatory questions. I also think there is a great deal of opportunity to streamline the flow of information and communication from the geographically dispersed Chapters back to PEO Council. Our goal is to become a valuable source of actionable information supporting PEO's mandate to regulate the practice in the public interest.

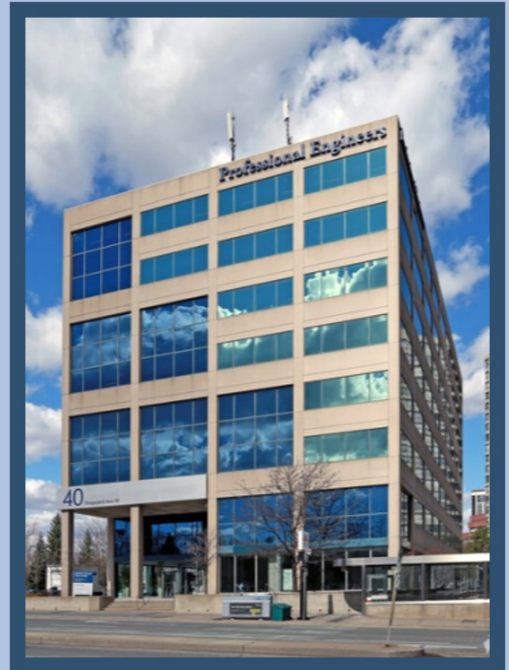
