OVER 80 ENGINEERS AND EIGHT MPPS PARTICIPATE IN PEO'S 2020 GOVERNMENT RELATIONS CONFERENCE

As reported on page 1, PEO hosted their online 2020 Government Relations Conference last Friday. The day included remarks from three party leaders and two Attorney General Critics. There were also moderated panels, MPP interviews and a keynote address from Canada's first female engineer ever elected to the House of Commons **Marilyn Gladu**, P.Eng. (see pages 1 and 4 to 8). This Conference was an opportunity for PEO GLP Chairs to receive necessary training to help them build relationships with MPPs and host meetings, as well as an important way to raise PEO's profile with government.

PEO officials met with an Ottawa MPP **Stephen Blais** (Orléans) on November 9 (see page 3). As elections and by-elections continue to happen, it is crucial that PEO establish relationships with newly elected MPPs, so that they can continue to stay top of mind.

The Budget presents a three pronged approach of 'Protect, Support, Recover' in response to the impact the COVID-19 pandemic has had on the province.

The Government has committed to a long-term infrastructure plan, investments in new skills training programs and opportunities business property tax relief in the form of reducing electricity bills and more.

PEO held a meeting with Stephen Blais, MPP (Orléans) on November 9.

Participating from PEO were CEO/Registrar **Johnny Zuccon**, P.Eng., Manager, Government Liaison Programs **Jeannette Chau**, P.Eng., former Councillor and Acting Division Manager, Licensing and Manager of Enforcement **Cliff Knox**, P.Eng. and Government Relations Consultant **Howard Brown**.

Also participating was MPP Blais' assistant Jordan Faris.

MPP Blais was elected in a by-election in February 2020.

He is the Liberal Critic for Municipal Affairs and Housing, Transportation and Infrastructure, Government and Consumer Services and Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation.

His riding of Orléans was represented in the past by **Phil McNeely**, P.Eng., a long-time PEO licence holder.

MPP Blais requested the meeting to learn more about PEO's work in protecting the public interest.

He is a former Ottawa City Councillor.

It is important for PEO to build relationships with newly elected officials, who may not be familiar with the work of PEO and its mandate.

It's an opportunity to stay top of mind and ensure all members of the Legislature are informed about the work of professional engineers and the ways in which they are regulated.


"I did take an interest and met with representatives of your regulatory body," said MPP Collard. "Those meetings were very informative for me, as I learned about the important work done by PEO."

Minister Clark said, "MPPs are the direct conduit that the local community has with government. I've always talked about the fact that PEO has an exemplary reputation as an organization that connects with government at a grassroots level."

Another interview was held with **Will Bouma**, MPP (Brantford-Brant),
Parliamentary Assistant to the Premier and
Conference Committee Co-Chair **Vicki Hilborn**, P.Eng., who is the PEO Brantford
Chapter Chair.

MPP Bouma said, "Engineers are such a fundamental part of our society. Your work is connected with every piece of our life and I marvel at that. I appreciate what you bring to the table and I appreciate our relationships."

The final interview was held with Jennifer French, MPP (Oshawa), NDP Transportation, Highways and Infrastructure Critic and PEO Lake Ontario GLP Chair Pankaj Panchal, P.Eng.

MP GLADU DELIVERS KEYNOTE ADDRESS AT CONFERENCE

Ms. English also took part in a one on one interview with PEO Councillor **Warren Turnbull**, P.Eng., Chair of the Government Liaison Committee.

The two spoke about strategies used in B.C. to form relationships with government (e.g. individual caucus receptions), project working groups, and tailoring messaging for each Party.

Mr. Turnbull later provided a wrap up for the day after remarks by PEO CEO/Registrar **Johnny Zuccon**, P.Eng.

Marilyn Gladu, P.Eng., MP (Sarnia-Lambton) was the keynote speaker at the PEO Government Relations Conference.

MP Gladu said, "Reach out to MPPs, but be aware that they may not know about PEO. Always prepare a concise message and leave a meeting with a recap summary document. The benefits of having strong relationships is its easier to access elected officials that way."

Following her address, a Q&A was held with MP Gladu and PEO Vice-President (Elected) **Darla Campbell**, P.Eng. and Conference attendees.


MP Gladu was also the guest speaker at the PEO 2016 Student Government Relations Conference.

Earlier in the day, a panel was held on the topic of self-regulation. The moderator was PEO President **Marisa Sterling**, P.Eng.



Topics discussed included the advantages and disadvantages of self-regulation, B.C. governments new framework for regulation and the public's understanding of the profession.

PEO Manager, Government Liaison Programs Jeannette Chau, P.Eng. and Government Relations Consultant Howard Brown provided attendees with an overview of why government relations is important to PEO during the morning session.

They also discussed four key PEO regulatory items that have impacted PEO.

They examined PEO's impact on the Ontario Building Code, the Industrial Exception, the Elliot Lake Inquiry and the Cayton External Regulatory Review.

Five members of the PEO Government Relations Conference planning committee hosted three breakout sessions for participants.

- GLP 101– presented by Ms. Chau. This was primarily for new GLP reps, who are learning the foundations of the Government Liaison Program.
- GLP 201 presented by PEO
 Government Liaison Committee (GLC)
 Vice-Chair and Councillor Arjan Arenja,
 P.Eng. and Mr. Brown. This session was
 a more advanced discussion on best
 practices for liaising with Ministers and
 MPP, including writing tips.
- GLP 301-presented by GLC Chair and PEO Councillor Warren Turnbull, P.Eng., Conference Co-Chair and PEO Councillor Lorne Cutler, P.Eng. and GLC Engineers Canada representative Changiz Sadr, P.Eng. It provided participants with an opportunity to ask questions related to the Government Liaison Program, as well as comment on its strengths and weaknesses.
