My name is Arthur Sinclair, an Engineer with leadership and vision.

In my <u>first email</u>, I spoke of the need for licencing and committee reform at the PEO. In this email I will talk about self-regulation.

Self-regulation engages professional expertise and provides a level of autonomy from other government interest. To regulate one's profession is not a right. It is a responsibility and a privilege bestowed by statute that outlines the need for licensing, discipline & enforcement, and standards of practice.

While appropriate standards of practice can serve the public good, professionals must no be burdened by ineffective, unnecessary, and outdated regulations. This is why I believe in the risk-based principles of "right touch regulation" where one must understand the problem before jumping to the solution. Sometimes solutions in place do not apply to today's reality, hence my focus on **PEO's modernisation**.

Self-regulation gone wrong can erode public trust in the organization and by extension confidence in its members. I believe that **effective self-regulation contributes to a positive public perception of P.Eng. licence holders.**

PEO members' interests matter, which is why in 2000 PEO council created the Ontario Society of Professional Engineers (OSPE) "to create a separate organization dedicated to advancing the interests and aspirations of members and promoting the profession". I will strengthen the PEO-OSPE relationship to be more effective serving members' and public interests.

Self-regulation without self-interest is possible with <u>leadership</u>, <u>integrity</u>, and <u>transparency</u>, which is why these three words feature prominently in all my campaign material. I take a lot of pride in being a Professional Engineer and Self-regulation is part of the reason.
