This is one of PEO's most important elections in many years. PEO is facing challenges that will profoundly impact its future, even its existence as the self-regulatory body of the profession. PEO must remain relevant to the Province, to the public and to its members. Council composition is critical; councillors should be knowledgeable, honest and transparent. Council decisions must be well informed and reflect PEO's primary mandate, the protection of the public interest.

I offer over 17 years of experience volunteering for PEO. I know what works well and what needs improvement.

Matters that must be urgently addressed by Council:

- Adding value to licence holders: New graduates must realize value from being licensed;
 PEO, as the licensing body certifies that the holder possesses the competencies to practice in a manner that effectively protects the public interest.
- Cooperative work amongst PEO staff, Chapters and Committees. Volunteer's engagement. End the "silo" culture.

 Act. The current definition does not necessarily capture all the work that engineers do,
