I am concerned about the future of our profession:

1. For PEO to remain relevant, we must be willing to adopt a governance culture that consistently makes decisions that serve and protect public interests. Self-regulation is a privilege, not a right, and PEO is in danger of losing this privilege, similar to the situation in BC and Quebec who failed to change.
2. As part of the final phase of governance review, PEO will be evaluating its volunteer structure. PEO needs to continue to leverage the strength of its license holders to position itself on a path to become a more responsive, progressive regulator.
3. Implement a shorter and simplified licensing process to make the progression through licensure less demanding for Canadian and international engineering graduates.
