



# P.ENG. TRANSFER GUIDE & APPLICATION FORM PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER (P.ENG.) LICENCE

This professional engineer licence application package contains:

- a description of the licensing requirements
- a licence application
- information on fees and payment methods

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Professional Engineers Ontario (PEO) is the organization that is mandated, under the *Professional Engineers Act*, with setting the standards for admission and with regulating the practice of professional engineering in Ontario. To practise as a professional engineer in Ontario, an individual must be licensed by PEO.

### LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

To be granted a licence to practise professional engineering, the applicant must:

- Be at least 18 years old;
- Be of good character;
- Hold a bachelor's degree in an engineering program from a Canadian university that is accredited to the Council's satisfaction, or equivalent engineering educational qualifications recognized by the Council;
- the National Professional Practice Exam (NPPE); and
- Demonstrate at least 48 months of verifiable, acceptable engineering experience, at least 12 months of which must be acquired in a Canadian jurisdiction under a licensed professional engineer (P.Eng.).

PEO will accept a licence application before a prospective applicant has satisfied all of the above-noted requirements; however, all requirements must be satisfied before a licence can be granted.

Please note that PEO reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to request additional information or proof of information provided, at any time a during the application and licensing process, to ensure that requirements for licensure are satisfied. This may include, but is not limited to, signed documentation, either originals or certified copies, additional proof of identification or qualifications, names and contact information for referees etc.

In accordance with PEO's governing legislation, an applicant for licence must be able to communicate adequately in the English language. Therefore, if a question is raised with respect to this ability, PEO will make this determination.

### TRANSFER APPLICANTS

An individual who is licensed as a professional engineer (P.Eng.) in good standing with another Canadian engineering regulator can apply to become licensed as a P.Eng. licence holder with PEO.

To apply as a P.Eng. transfer applicant, you are required to submit a current resume, an acceptable identification document, and your completed application form. Please submit this information to <a href="mailto:peng.transfers@peo.on.ca">peng.transfers@peo.on.ca</a>.

P.Eng. transfer applicants are not required to submit transcripts or write the National Professional Practice Examination, because they satisfied the overall licensing requirements with their initial Canadian engineering regulator.

If you have applied to or were licensed by PEO in the past, please state this information in the good character section of your transfer application form.

Please note, there is no mobility agreement for Engineer-in-Training or Engineering Interns (EIT) in Canada, and individuals cannot transfer their EIT membership between Canadian engineering regulators. Only individuals who are a P.Eng. licence holder with another Canadian regulator can submit a P.Eng. transfer application.

After all required information is received and it is determined that your P.Eng. transfer application can proceed, your application will be processed and you will be required to pay the appropriate fees.

### MAY I DO ENGINEERING WORK WHILE MY APPLICATION IS BEING CONSIDERED?

Yes. You may do engineering work, provided a licence holder takes responsibility for your work. In Ontario, it is illegal to use the title "professional engineer" or any variation of it as an occupational or business title if you are not licensed by PEO.

### **COSTS TO BECOME LICENSED**

- Application fee of \$360 + HST (total \$406.80);
- Final registration/licensing fee of \$300 + HST (total \$339).
   You will be invoiced for this fee upon licensing;
- 3. Annual fees of \$265+HST (total \$299.45)

NOTE: All costs are non-refundable. Please ensure that all documents to support your application are submitted to PEO at the time you apply.

### HOW TO COMPLETE A P.ENG. TRANSFER APPLICATION

1. TYPE OF APPLICATION

This application form is specific to Transfers. Please only complete this application form if you are currently licensed as a P.Eng. licence holder with a Canadian engineering regulator.

### 2. NAME

This is the name that will appear on your licence certificate. Enter your full legal name exactly as shown on your proof of age and identity.

Enter your date of birth and indicate your gender by checking the appropriate box.

### 3. PROOF OF AGE AND IDENTITY

To be eligible for a licence, an applicant must be at least eighteen (18) years of age. To verify your age and identity, you must include a photocopy (both sides) of a government-issued identification document(s) provided it specifies your full name and date of birth. Acceptable documents include:

- Driver's licence
- Canadian Birth Certificate, or a proof of birth document
- Canadian Permanent Resident Card (both sides)
- Canadian Citizenship Card (both sides)
- Record of Landing
- Student/Work Authorization

### 4. CURRENT RESIDENCE ADDRESS

Provide your current residence address, telephone number and e-mail address.

## 5. ACADEMIC BACKGROUND Specify:

- type of earned undergraduate (bachelor's) and postgraduate (master's, doctorate) degrees (e.g. B.A.Sc., M.A.Sc., Ph.D.);
- · the discipline of study;
- name and location (city/country) of the degree-granting institution(s); and
- the date (month/year) each degree was granted.

### 6. GOOD CHARACTER

In addition to the education and experience requirements, the *Professional Engineers Act* stipulates that a prospective licence holder must be of good character for licensing as a professional engineer. Please answer the questions in this section by checking the appropriate box. If you answer "yes" to any of the questions, provide details on a separate sheet.

### 7. APPLICANT'S DECLARATION

Read and complete the declaration carefully before signing your licence application.

### **GOOD CHARACTER**

Subsection 14(1)(e) of the Ontario *Professional Engineers Act* requires that all applicants be of good character to obtain a professional engineer licence. The Act also provides that if an applicant's past conduct affords grounds for belief that the person will not engage in the practice of professional engineering according to the law and with honesty and integrity, a licence may not be issued.

All applicants must answer all of the following questions to enable the Registrar to determine whether the applicant is of good character and whether there is any basis for refusing to issue a licence given the applicant's past conduct. By providing this information, you consent to PEO contacting the relevant professional engineering licensing body(ies) or equivalent organization(s) and their providing this information to PEO.

An affirmative answer to any of these questions does not necessarily mean that you will be refused a licence.
