FINANCE MINISTER RELEASES ONTARIO FALL ECONOMIC STATEMENT



Finance Minister Peter Bethlenfalvy, MPP (Pickering-Uxbridge) spoke at a Canadian Club reception on October 31.

The province's Fall Economic Statement titled *Ontario's Plan to Build: A Progress Update*, was released by Finance Minister **Peter Bethlenfalvy**, MPP (Pickering-Uxbridge) on November 14. Minister Bethlenfalvy had a chance to meet PEO Lake Ontario Chapter Chair **Manraj Pannu**, P.Eng., at an Economic Club of Canada event in 2019.

Minister Bethlenfalvy spoke about his plan on October 31 at a Canadian Club reception which was attended by PEO Government Relations Consultant **Howard Brown.** Mr. Brown had a chance to speak to the Minister at the reception prior to his speech.

The statement projected Ontario will have a \$12.9 billion deficit. It is is almost \$7 billion less than what was projected in the 2022 budget, due to inflation and taxation.

Here is an excerpt from the statement: "The government's capital plan is one of the most ambitious in the province's history, with planned investments over the next 10 years totalling \$159.3 billion, including \$20.0 billion in 2022–23. This plan is getting shovels in the ground to build highways, hospitals and other critical assets, laying the foundation for a stronger and more productive Ontario."

"As we navigate these uncertain economic times," said Minister Bethlenfalvy, "our government is enhancing its plan through new targeted measures that support families, seniors and small businesses."

KEVIN HOLLAND, MPP

Kevin Holland represents the Progressive Conservative Party. He is the Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. He was first elected in the June 2022 general election.

Prior to his election, MPP Holland was the Mayor of the Township of Conmee and served on their council for over 30 years. He was a member of multiple boards and most recently served as the First Vice-Chair of the Rural Ontario Municipal Association (ROMA) and as a board member of the Northwestern Ontario Municipal Association.

He was also the Operations Manager of Holland Enterprises, a family-owned business that specializes in the manufacturing of custom emergency vehicles and commercial truck bodies.

SOL MAMAKWA, MPP

Sol Mamakwa is a member of the New Democratic Party and Deputy Leader of the Official Opposition. He is also the critic on Northern Development and Indigenous and Treaty Relations.

Prior to MPP Mamakwa's election to the legislature in 2018, he was a health advocate, serving as co-chair for the Sioux Lookout Meno Ya Win Health Centre and on other regional health boards.

He has advocated for the North as a whole where he introduced two private member's bills, the first of which would have made the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples a part of provincial law. The second would have mandated the government to provide clean water in all First Nations in the province.
