

Mr. Khadra is the PEO representative for Minister Clark's riding.

Minister Clark has worked closely with PEO since his first election in 2010, regularly attending and speaking at PEO events at Queen's Park and in the riding.

He was a guest speaker at two GLP Academies and Congresses, one in Kingston and one in Gananoque, and also met with PEO's leadership at Queen's Park.

Minister Clark is very familiar with PEO and its initiatives to comply with the amendments to the *Fair Access to the Regulated Professions and Compulsory Trades Act* (FARPACTA) and also to implement compulsory PEAK as of January 1, 2023.

Chapter events are a good opportunity for PEO licence holders and Chapter representatives to bring MPPs up to date on PEO's work.

MINISTER SPEAKS AT BOARD OF TRADE TRANSPORTATION SYMPOSIUM



Transportation Minister **Caroline Mulroney**, MPP (York-Simcoe) spoke at the Toronto Region Board of Trade on February 8.

Ontario Minister of Transportation and Francophone Affairs **Caroline Mulroney**, MPP (York-Simcoe) was the keynote speaker at the Toronto Region Board of Trade Annual Transportation Symposium on February 8.

At the event, Minister Mulroney discussed Ontario's transit system, the region's landscape following the COVID-19 pandemic, and important projects like the GO rail expansion and the Toronto Waterfront East LRT. Attendees alongside leading experts, influencers and policy-makers had a chance to discuss critical transportation issues that face the province.

The event was sponsored by SNC Lavalin, and more than 300 business and engineering community leaders participated. A question period followed, which was moderated by **Jan De Silva**, President and CEO of the Toronto Region Board of Trade. Other speakers included CEO of the Toronto Transit Commission **Rick Leary**, former Toronto Deputy Mayor, **Ana Bailão**, and UK Trade Commissioner for North America, **Emma Wade-Smith**.

Minister Mulroney was Attorney General before assuming her current post in 2019, with responsibility for the *Professional Engineers Act*. She also met with her then-GLP rep, **Dale Kerr Genge**, P.Eng., who was elected as a councillor for Georgina in the fall municipal election.

PEO *GLP Weekly Times* also attended the session and had an opportunity to speak with Minister Mulroney.

PEO Lake Ontario Chapter GLP representative **Wintta Ghebreiyesus**, EIT attended a Democracy Forum on February 9 at Toronto Metropolitan University (TMU). The event was called Two Women In Power: Still Fighting for Fairness, and it was hosted by *Toronto Star* Queen's Park columnist **Martin Regg Cohn**, who was a guest speaker at the 2018 PEO Government Relations Conference.

Participating in the conversation were Ontario's Associate Minister of Women's Social and Economic Opportunity, **Charmaine Williams**, MPP (Brampton Centre) and Federal Minister for Women and Gender Equality and Youth, **Marci Ien**, MP (Toronto Centre).

PEO is a part of an Engineers Canada initiative called 30 by 30, which hopes to have 30% of its licensees be female by the year 2030.

February is Black History Month, and the Ministers addressed the need for listening to and empathizing with the experiences of disproportionately represented groups. Minister Williams was the first Black woman elected to Brampton City Council in 2018 and Minister Ien is the second Black member in her current role.

She holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Toronto and a Juris doctor from the University of Ottawa's Faculty of Common Law.

Chandra Pasma, MPP is the NDP's Critic for Education, and Poverty and Homelessness Eradication.

MPP Chandra was a public policy researcher for the Canadian Union of Public Employees, before being elected to the Legislature in the 2022 provincial election.
