### PEO MOVES FORWARD ON GOVERNANCE PLAN



555th Meeting of PEO Council on February 24.

PEO Council held its 555th meeting at PEO Headquarters on February 24. The meeting included reports from President **Nick Colucci**, P.Eng., who chaired the meeting, and a report from CEO/Registrar **Jennifer Quaglietta**, P.Eng. She provided an update on PEO's work to comply with the *Fair Access to Regulated Professions and Compulsory Trades Act* (FARPACTA), as well as an update on the PEAK mandatory continuing professional development program.

PEO Council heard and considered recommendations around Phase 4 of the risk assessment process for the Governance Roadmap, related to the Order of Honour selection criteria and PEO committee and task force activities which are neither governance nor regulatory. The recommendations were proposed by Councillor **Arjan Arenja**, P.Eng., Chair of the Governance of the Nominating Committee (GNC).

Council voted to refer the Order of Honour Review back to the GNC for further consideration and to report back to Council at its March 2023 meeting.

Regarding the GNC recommendations around PEO committee and task force activities which are neither governance nor regulatory, Council agreed to stand down eight (non-governance nor regulatory) committees and sub-committees effective immediately. It also approved the transfer the President's Award (for non-engineers) to OSPE, to be renamed as the Engineering Ally Award. Council also approved to suspend the V.G. Smith and S.E. Wolfe Thesis awards, until further review.

Council also decided to support the "Retool the Iron Ring Ritual" initiative. It requested the Corporation of the Seven Wardens to implement meaningful changes to the Ritual of the Calling of an Engineer ceremony in ways that reflect contemporary engineering practice, values and inclusion.

Council approved the CEO/Registrar's goals, and Chief Elections Officer, **Allison Elliot**, P.Eng., presented a report on the 2023 Council Election. Other reports were given by past President **Christian Bellini**, P.Eng., on PEO's progress towards Engineers Canada's 30x30 initiative, which aims to raise the percentage of newly licensed engineers who are women to 30 per cent by the year 2030. Past President Bellini also provided an update on the work of the Anti-Racism and Anti-Discrimination Exploratory Working Group.

During the session, PEO Council also nominated Councillor **Tim Kirkby**, P.Eng., as the newest Ontario member of the Board of Engineers Canada.





# KINGSTON MPP SENDS ENCOURAGING VIDEO TO CHAPTER ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING



**Ted Hsu**, MPP (Kingston and the Islands), Liberal Critic for Energy, Mines, Natural Resources and Forestry, and Citizenship and Multiculturalism provided a video message for the Kingston Chapter AGM on February 21.

KINGSTON - PEO Kingston Chapter held its Annual General Meeting (AGM) at the Four Point Sheraton Hotel in Kingston on February 21. Chapter GLP Chair **Hafiz Bashur**, P.Eng., reported that **Ted Hsu**, MPP (Kingston and the Islands) sent a video message.

MPP Hsu is the Liberal Critic for Energy, Mines, Natural Resources and Forestry, and Citizenship and Multiculturalism. He spoke about the important role that PEO and the 1,000 engineers in the Kingston Chapter play in ensuring public safety. He said in part:

"At a time when our society feels like it is cracking under so many strains, it is important to remember the role of professional societies as we rebuild. When you're doing your job, you have to make decisions under certain constraints, it is important to have professional standards under those constraints. Professional standards remind engineers to ask, have I spent enough time checking the facts or searching through my profession's accumulated experience? Have I paid enough attention to safety, the environment or any other non-financial externalities? Have I followed best practices of my profession's ethical standards? Thank you to PEO and professional societies and colleges for being the custodians of the standards that help define how developed we are as a society."

HAMILTON - A by-election has been called for March 16 for the riding of Hamilton Centre to fill the vacancy created by the retirement of **Andrea Horwath**, who served as the MPP for Hamilton Centre since 2007.

On October 24, 2022, Ms. Horwath was elected as Hamilton's first female Mayor. She is a long-time supporter of PEO.

The candidates announced so far for the Hamilton Centre by-election are **Lucia lannantuono** for the Green Party, **Sarah Jama** for the Ontario New Democratic Party, **Deirdre Pike** for the Ontario Liberal Party, and **Pete Wiesner** for the Progressive Conservative Party of Ontario.


