COVID-19 Misinformation in PEO Council Agenda

Briefly describe the issue:

In the agenda for the March 2023 PEO Council meeting, Mr. Gregory Wowchuk included a link to a presentation document containing factual errors and conspiracy theories about vaccinations and COVID-19.

Perhaps Mr. Wowchuk did not observe the disclaimer on the Canadian COVID Care Alliance (CCCA) website which states, unequivocally: "Do not make any decisions based on the information contained or presented on this website without consulting an appropriate professional."

Perhaps Mr. Wowchuk was unaware of investigations by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario related to members of the CCCA and associated organizations.

With this submission, we wish to bring these possible oversights to the attention of both Mr. Wowchuk and Council so that rectifying actions can be taken and to, hopefully, ensure that similar oversights do not happen in the future.

Summarize the action that you are requesting from Council and how it will address the issue

Five actions are requested. They are that:

1. the Council motion in question be formally retracted,

- 2. Council release a formal statement rejecting the inclusion of misinformation in its business.
- 3. Councillors be required to engage with governance education and/or obtain governance designations prior to participating in Council business,
- 4. Future potential Councillors receive communications prior to elections regarding desired qualifications and required duties, and
- 5. In the lead up to elections, members should be clearly notified in writing of candidate status within PEO (e.g. Practising status, disciplinary history, etc.) and any potential conflicts of interest.

Cite and briefly summarize any research that supports the proposed action

The presentation cited in the Council agenda was by the Canadian COVID Care Alliance (CCCA). The co-founder of the CCCA, Dr. Ira Bernstein, has had his licence restricted by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. His associates in Canadian COVID Telehealth and Angels' Heart, Drs. Patrick Phillips and Christopher Hassell, have also been investigated by CPSO. One has been suspended and the other was found to have engaged in "professional misconduct".

How the proposed action will contribute to serving and protecting the public interest

Just as we require that PEO members demonstrate knowledge, skill and judgment in the undertaking of their professional responsibilities, Councillors should endeavor to do likewise in Council. Supporting documentation used within Council business should be reasonably free of error and, when errors are discovered or pointed out, Council should engage in efforts to rectify any and all affected items of business.

One only needs to look to the recent actions of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario to see how another self-regulating body deals with misinformation related to COVID-19 in order to protect the public interest. Through its investigative and enforcement actions, the CPSO has shown itself to be worthy of emulation. PEO should follow the example set by CPSO and review how we can improve ourselves, both in the internal policy context but also, if the need arises, in the professional engineering enforcement context.
