# TORONTO'S CHIEF ENGINEER, MPP AND PROFESSORS HEADLINE PEO GLP SUMMIT

Over 70 PEO GLP representatives gathered on November 18th for what many are calling one of the best day-long sessions in the program's almost 20-year history.

Over 15 speakers highlighted the Summit, which featured:

- New City of Toronto Chief Engineer Jennifer Graham Harkness, P. Eng, a former deputy Minister with the Ministry of Transportation of Ontario,
- Deepak Anand, MPP (Mississauga-Malton), Parliamentary
   Assistant to the Minister of Labour, Immigration, Training and
   Skills Development and an engineering graduate,
- **Ken Jull**, a legal expert and author of the leading textbooks for law students studying regulatory law and corporate governance.

They discussed the topic of building public trust through regulating the practice of professional engineering.

# ATTORNEY GENERAL DOWNEY'S ADDRESS TO THE PEO GLP TRAINING SUMMIT



The following is a transcript of Attorney General Doug Downey's address to attendees of the PEO GLP Training Summit

Good afternoon everyone. I'm Doug Downey, Ontario's Attorney General.

Thank you for inviting me to bring greetings to today's event, it's always a pleasure. I'd like to begin by expressing my appreciation for the work you do, as Professional Engineers of Ontario. Thank you for your steadfast leadership and continued work across the province.

It has been an exciting few years as we continue to literally "Build Ontario" together, expanding access to justice, breaking down longstanding barriers in the system, and moving forward with vital infrastructure projects. Today's Summit comes at an exciting time in this province because our government is building for the next generation of newcomers. We are experiencing rapid growth across the province, so it goes without saying that we need to build transit, roads, hospitals, schools, and housing. That's why today's event is so vital. Leaders in the engineering, political and regulatory fields coming together to share ideas and best practices in support of your Government Liaison Program. I'm proud of this ongoing collaboration, because we couldn't put shovels in the ground without your expertise. You are on the front lines of innovation, transforming the places where we work, live and play. Our economy and communities grow stronger because of what you do. The engineering profession in Ontario will continue to grow stronger as we work together to break down barriers.

This year's Less Red Tape, More Common Sense Act proposes some important amendments to the Professional Engineers Act. If passed, these amendments would ensure that processes are improved and further clarified, including: supporting the electronic delivery of notices and documents, the mandatory reporting of regulatory information and clarifying the process for the Complaints Committee to act on Registrar investigation reports. Even smaller changes like these have an impact, making your work easier and letting you focus on what truly matters within your profession. These changes also reflect our fundamental goals as a government, to modernize and streamline regulatory processes and move away from paper-based communication. We are listening to your feedback and working to ensure that high standards are maintained.

I want to thank the Professional Engineers of Ontario, including the representatives of PEO's Government Liaison Program for your continued work to maintain the highest level of professionalism among engineers working in the public interest. The province of Ontario relies on your expertise, experience and partnership, and we will continue to do so in the years to come.

# PEO COUNCIL VOTES TO HOLD 2024 AGM IN BARRIE

PEO Council met on November 16th and 17th for the 560th meeting, outlining final steps before entering 2024. It was Chaired by PEO President **Roydon Fraser**, P.Eng.

External attendees of the meeting included **Sheryl Cameron** and **Candace Whitney**, who both serve as counsel on justice policy in the office of the Attorney General, as well as **James Mandel** and **Anna Eisner**, compliance analysts in the office of the Ontario Fairness Commissioner.

Council approved a motion that, effective as of December 31, 2023, the Licensing Committee, Enforcement Committee and Professional Standards Committee be stood down with Council's thanks and appreciation to all current and previous members. At its March 2023 meeting, Council directed staff to develop one or more Advisory Groups to replace these three committees. An advisory group will now be established to provide input, guidance and recommendations to staff on potential strategies and activities related to PEO's regulatory mandate.

Council approved a proposed plan to examine P.Eng. experience requirements using PEO's Policy Development Framework.

As part of her CEO/Registrar Update, **Jennifer Quaglietta**, P.Eng., provided additional information on the progress of the *Fair Access to Regulatory Professions and Compulsory Trades Act* (FARPACTA), Continuing Education/PEAK, and proposed changes to the *Professional Engineers Act*. Council also approved the location for PEO's next annual general meeting (AGM), which will take place in Barrie on Saturday, April 20, 2024. Barrie is also significant for being represented by both Attorney General **Doug Downey**, MPP (Barrie--Springwater--Oro-Medonte) and Environment, Conservation and Parks Minister **Andrea Khanjin**, MPP (Barrie--Innisfil).
