MPP Byers was introduced by the Chapter's new GLP Chair **Julian Glowacki**, P.Eng., who explained that PEO is "the regulator of professional engineering in the public interest and that PEO's jurisdiction comes from the province in the *Professional Engineers Act*.

He was also thanked by GLP Rep **Kiran Thomas**., P.Eng. Following his speech to the attendees he was briefed on PEO issues by Mr. Glowacki, Mr. Thomas, Chapter Chair **Bill Hrinivich**, P.Eng., **Roberto Clemente**, P.Eng., and PEO Government Relations Consultant **Howard Brown**, who also attended the meeting. The main points of the briefing included:

- Fair Access to Regulated Professions and Compulsory Trades Act (FARPACTA) and its impact on licensing
- Continuing Professional Development (PEAK) requirements
- Opportunities to participate in a Take Your MPP to Work event in his riding

It was also explained to MPP Byers that the *Professional Engineers Act* is under the jurisdiction of the Attorney General.

MPP Byers thanked the Chapter for inviting him to participate in the event, and he told them that he had a particular interest in the regulation of engineering as two of his sons are studying engineering.

Patrice Barnes, MPP (Ajax) was the guest speaker at Toronto Metropolitan University's inaugural Student Rocketry Conference on March 16. At the time of the event MPP Barnes was the Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Education. As reported in last week's *PEO GLP Weekly Times* Premier **Doug Ford** appointed her Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Labour, Immigration, Training and Skills Development.

The event was organized by PEO Ajax Chapter GLP Rep **Wintta Ghebreiyesus**, EIT., who also was on the organizing committee for the 2023 PEO GLP Training Summit. The event was also attended by PEO West Toronto Chapter GLP Rep **Erem Altunbulakli**, P.Eng.

FAIRNESS COMMISSIONER RELEASES ANNUAL REPORT WITH FARPACTA UPDATES

The Office of Ontario's Fairness Commissioner **Irwin Glasberg**, released their <u>March 2024 newsletter</u> which featured the online release of their latest annual report, as well as updates on amendments to the *Fair Access to Regulated Professions and Compulsory Trades Act* (FARPACTA).

The FARPACTA amendments introduced new legal obligations for regulated professions relating to:

- Establishing time limits for making decisions on applications for registration, internal reviews and / or appeals.
- The ability of regulated professions to retain Canadian experience requirements.
- Developing Emergency Registration Plans.
- Accepting the results of language proficiency tests approved under the federal Immigration and Refugee Protection Act.
- Working in consultation with their responsible ministers to ensure that, as
 a matter of public interest, the people of Ontario have access to adequate
 numbers of qualified, skilled and competent regulated professionals.
- Fulfilling new reporting obligations.



Mr. Glasberg was appointed as Ontario's Fairness Commissioner on January 10, 2020. His office oversees the registration processes of 41 regulated professions and health regulatory colleges, including PEO, whose members participate in key sectors of the provincial economy. He has worked closely with PEO and last spoke at PEO Council on March 31, 2023 and at the <u>GLP Training Summit on October 21, 2022.</u>

PEO COUNCIL RECOGNIZES PASSING OF PEO'S SECOND WOMAN PRESIDENT



Mary Jane Phillips, PhD, P.Eng., who served as PEO's second woman president from 1993 to 1994, passed away on March 18 in Toronto at the age of 92.

Dr. Phillips was a lifetime member of PEO, and served on and chaired many committees, including 35 years of service on the Complaints Committee, of which she was Chair from 2003 to 2009.

An inspiration to women in engineering, Dr. Phillips taught at the University of Toronto, her alma mater, where she led the development of the Ethics in Engineering course and was involved in early Equity, Diversity and Inclusion, and Women in Engineering committees.

At the 562nd meeting of PEO Council on April 5, PEO recognized the passing of Dr. Phillips and her longtime service to PEO.

A memorial service will be held on Wednesday, May 29, 2024 at 11:00 a.m. at St. Clement's Church, 70 St. Clements Avenue, Toronto.
