BARRIE - Attorney General **Doug Downey**, MPP (Barrie--Springwater--Oro-Medonte) joined the opening of the FIRST Robotics Championships (FRC) weekend competition held at Georgian College from March 15-17.

According to the <u>FRC website</u>, the competition showcases high school students and their brilliance in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM). The theme of the event was 'Crescendo' and celebrated the fusion of STEM skills with the arts.

FRC events are hosted across nine district competitions in Ontario by FIRST Robotics Canada and their partners, with teams competing across multiple district events to earn points and secure their spot at the highly anticipated Provincial Championship.

# FORMER AG WHO MADE MAJOR CHANGES TO THE PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS ACT PASSES

**Roy McMurtry**, who served as Ontario's Attorney General from 1975 to 1985 passed away on March 18 in Toronto at the age of 91.

Mr. McMurtry, a lawyer who had a long-time interest in the engineering profession, was also a former Chief Justice of Ontario.

In 1984, he brought in significant changes to the *Professional Engineers Act* to strengthen its application in the public interest.

Mr. McMurtry had a chance to meet a number of PEO representatives over the years. On February 22, 2017, then PEO president **George Comrie**, P.Eng, headed a PEO delegation and spoke with Mr. McMurtry at Queen's Park.

The encounter took place by chance following a legislative hearing on proposed changes to the *Professional Engineers Act* that year.

### PEO ANNUAL MEETING SET FOR BARRIE
